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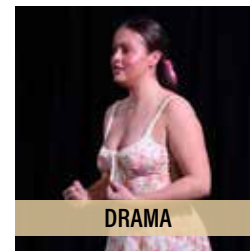
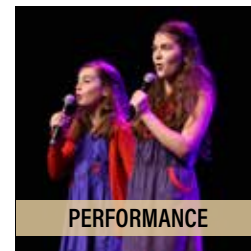
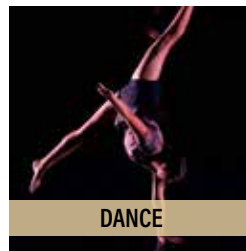

Arts in Focus

The Visual Arts department truly excelled at the recent Bicentenary CAPA evening, a testament to its passion and enterprise. Inspired by the underground Tank—a repurposed WWII oil reservoir turned exhibition space at the Art Gallery of New South Wales (AGNSW)—the event featured innovative uplighting to recreate this unique atmosphere, enhancing the overall experience.

Students showcased a diverse array of artworks, the result of extensive collaborations with the Art Gallery of NSW (AGNSW) and hands-on workshops led by visiting artists. Year 11 engaged in “Alchemy and Abstraction,” an artist project inspired by the Kandinsky exhibition and a 2 day sculptural fibre workshop with guest artist Brooke Munro, while Year 10 students explored the profound works of Louise Bourgeois in the exhibition “Has the Day Invaded the Night or Has the Night Invaded the Day?” This immersive experience deepened their understanding of human relationships in art.

Additionally, students participated in a discussion and workshop with acclaimed artist Wendy Sharpe, coinciding with her exhibition “Spellbound” at the AGNSW. This enriching interaction offered a rare opportunity for students to engage with an artist of such stature, making the evening a truly memorable celebration of creativity and artistic exploration.

Guest artists have featured heavily in our line-up. Year 9 Visual Arts were very fortunate to spend time working under esteemed Contemporary artist, Abdul Abdullah, a five time Archibald finalist. Abdullah’s approach to creating a human likeness is distinctive and allowed the students to create the bones of a successful portrait.

Bede Polding College, located in South Windsor in the beautiful Hawkesbury area, north-west of Sydney, has a strong tradition of student success in both the Creative and Performing Arts space, as well as in technological subjects such as Design & Technology and Agriculture.

As a comprehensive, coeducational high school of approximately 1200 students, there are a plethora of opportunities for students to engage with subjects they are passionate about, as well as many co-curricular offerings for students of all ages and ability levels. Students have received multiple nominations for 'Onstage' and 'Art Express' and have been highly competitive in a range of challenges and competitions. In 2024, talented Drama students Hayden Kelly, Finbar Hicks and Hendrix Donnelly, were nominated for possible inclusion for 'OnStage' for their Group Performance, and Leila Pierce for her individual performance.

In 2023, Kirrily Moss and Amie Bennett were nominated for 'Art Express', with Kirrily's artwork successful in this exhibition. Bede Polding College graduates are creative, curious, collaborative and critical thinking young people - lifelong learners who are equipped with the skills to navigate further study or employment, and to make a difference in the world around them.

Amelia was involved with the Sydney Youth Orchestra for the past 6 years, and more recently, has joined the Penrith Symphony Orchestra, where this year, as their youngest member, she has had the opportunity to support singers from Opera Australia at 'The Opera Gala'. Amelia has been a great blessing to the school community, with regular contributions to school Masses and Liturgies, and many collaborations and ensemble performances with other students and staff.

HYDROBOT RUMBLE CHALLENGE

This year, the College was exceptionally well represented by Year 9 students Eamon Kendall, Flynn Bonello-Garrow and Cameron Cwojdzinski in the 'HydroBot Rumble Challenge', achieving second place overall. This competition is run by STEM HUB, in partnership with Formula 1 Australian Grand Prix and BAE Systems, and requires students to design and build a model hydrogen-fuelled autonomous vehicle using materials of their choice, and in the final phase, prepare a presentation to highlight their design's features. This team of students dedicated many hours to the challenge, in their own time, as well as in the context of the 'DigiTech Group' - a co-curricular group regularly facilitated by dedicated staff, to encourage creative and technologically talented students to explore their ideas and develop new skills. Many of these students also take part in the annual 'iDesign @ Bede' Challenge, which gives them the opportunity to meet real-world technological needs in creative ways and receive support from College Alumni, who are experts in this field.

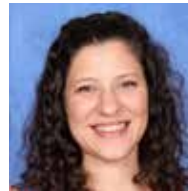
Mikayla Connor was the College Dux in 2023, with an ATAR of 96.85, and ranked first place in most of her HSC courses including English, Biology, PDHPE, Religion, and her real passion - Agriculture. It was this passion, along with her hard work, commitment and determination, that also resulted in her being ranked equal tenth place in the state for HSC Agriculture. Mikayla is now studying Veterinary Science at Charles Sturt University in Wagga Wagga - one of only 6 students to gain direct entry from year 12 in this cohort. The rigorous application process included extensive volunteer work at a range of locations, to gain hands-on experience with agricultural production animals. Mikayla was also awarded second place in the prestigious Norman Lethbridge Scholarship Award offered by the NSW Angus Society, receiving a significant financial grant and a training course at Tocal Agricultural College in the Hunter Valley. Mikayla is an exemplary student, a quiet achiever, and a role model for younger students at the College.

The Creative Arts at Domremy College

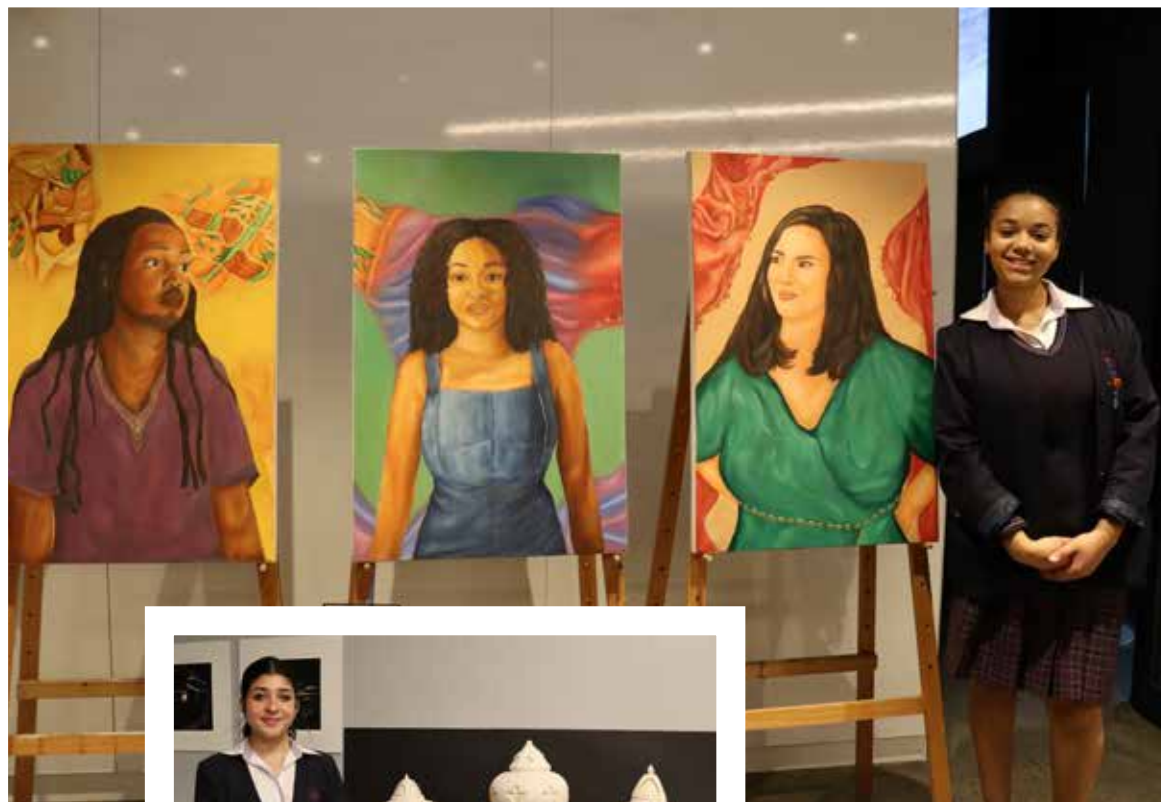
A hub of Talent and Innovation

EMPOWERING YOUNG WOMEN

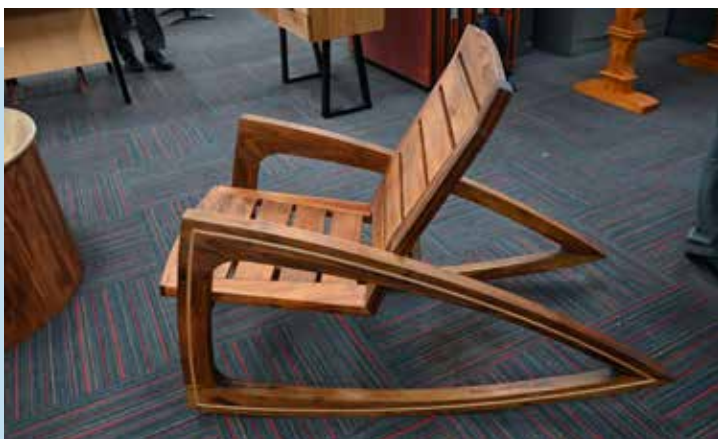
